Tiffany Joy Butler is an experimental filmmaker, writer, educator and curator. A daughter of a Black American and Puerto Rican family, her work wrestles with stories of rebellious, humorous curiosity. She is the founder of Hot Cabinet, a nomadic video screening initiative. Her films have screened at VIA Festival's Afronaut(a) 4.0, Queens Museum, Museum of Moving Image and A.I.R. Gallery. Her memoirs have been published as part of the *Bodega Monthly Anthology*, *Muchacha Zine* and *Telling Our Stories Press*. She has been a resident at the Vermont Studio Center and the Wassaic Project and she recently completed the AIM Fellowship of the Bronx Museum. She graduated with a BFA from Alfred University and currently resides in The Bronx.

The Blue Bus Project is a cultural vehicle that shatters the confines of the insular art world by taking artistic expression onto the road, promoting dialogue for social, artistic and political change by way of performance and visual arts. The Blue Bus Project is a platform for participants to contribute to their community while enhancing its beauty and cultural identity. It provides a safe space for conversations by partnering with educational institutions, local art organizations, city agencies, and individual artists. It brings joy, cultivates creativity, and serves as a bridge to connect people with their community.
